God Writes

On stone tablets

I will give you the stone tablets with the law and the commandment which <u>I have written</u> for their instruction. (Exo 24:12)

He gave Moses the two tablets of the testimony, tablets of stone, <u>written by the finger of God</u>. (Exo 31:18)

the tablets were God's work, and the writing was God's writing engraved on the tablets (Exo 32:16)

two tablets of stone <u>written by the finger of God</u>; and on them were all the words which the LORD had spoken (Deut 9:10)

On the wall

Suddenly the fingers of a man's hand emerged and began <u>writing</u> opposite the lampstand on the plaster of the wall...the hand that did the writing (Dan 5:5)

Then the hand was sent from Him and this inscription was written out. (Dan 5:24)

On the ground

Jesus stooped down and with His finger wrote on the ground (John 8:6)

again He stooped down and wrote on the ground (John 8:8)

Through His servants

Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write down these words, for in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel." (Exo 34:27)

Moses finished writing the words of this law in a book until they were complete (Deut 31:24)

write it on a tablet before them and inscribe it on a scroll, that it may serve in the time to come as a witness forever (Isa 30:8)

The word which came to Jeremiah from the LORD, saying, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, 'Write all the words which I have spoken to you in a book.'" (Jer 30:1-2)

the oath which is written in the law of Moses the servant of God (Dan 9:11)

I will tell you what is inscribed in the writing of truth (Dan 10:21)

beginning with <u>Moses</u> and with all the <u>prophets</u>, He explained to them the things <u>concerning Himself</u> in all the <u>Scriptures</u> (Luke 24:27)

all things which are <u>written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets</u> and the Psalms must be fulfilled (Luke 24:44)

Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD (Exo 24:4)

if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for he wrote of Me (John 5:46)

these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God (John 20:31)

For whatever was <u>written</u> in earlier times was <u>written</u> for our instruction, that through perseverance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. (Rom 15:4)

Now these things happened to them as an example, and they were <u>written</u> for our instruction (1Cor 10:11)

the sacred writings which are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God (2Tim 3:15-16)

Paul, according to the wisdom given him, <u>wrote</u> to you, as also in all his <u>letters</u>...which the untaught and unstable distort, as they do also the rest of the Scriptures (2Pet 3:15-16)

Blessed is he who reads and those who hear <u>the words of the prophecy</u>, and heed the things which are <u>written</u> in it (Rev 1:3)

Write in a book what you see, and send it to the seven churches (Rev 1:11)

<u>Write</u> therefore the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which shall take place after these things. (Rev 1:19)

I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of <u>this book</u>: if anyone adds to them, God shall add to him the plagues which are <u>written in this book</u>; and if anyone takes away from the words of <u>the book of this prophecy</u>, God shall take away his part from the tree of life and from the holy city, which are <u>written in this book</u>. (Rev 22:18-19)
